

"I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will praise you." -Psalm 22:22

Some of you probably already know that one of my hobbies is playing video games. One of the neat consequences of that is that I have made friends with people who play those same games and I get to talk with them regularly. I talk with people as close as Easton and as far away as Australia. Most of them are younger than me (way to make me feel old at 37)!

One of the more curious parts of conversations happen when they ask me, "What do you do for work?" Finding out that I am a pastor elicits a variety of responses, but one thing that has consistently amazed me is how many questions I received. Most of these people don't believe in God, or at least aren't sure whether or not God exists. Yet, there is a hungering for knowing more about this God that I serve.

It strikes me that the secularization of my and younger generations especially has left younger people with absolutely no religious background. They don't know the language. They don't know the stories. They don't know that God is not an angry tyrant, but a God of love and salvation. The old ways of talking to the "younger generation" about God just doesn't work anymore. We need to find new ways of bringing a message of God's hope to a world that knows nothing about that God and if they do they have a warped sense of who God actually is.

One of the things I hear from our congregational council is that we need to bring in more young people. That's true. I think we need to bring in everybody, young and old, but there is a clear lack of people my age and younger actively involved in the church. We're not alone in this as most of American Christianity is at a loss for how to reach these newer generations.

Sometime soon we will be putting together a Committee on Renewal. I know, I know. Another committee?! The work of this group is more about dreaming for the future and how we reach those in our community with the love of Jesus. It is my hope that this committee will bring ideas to the congregation, but it will depend on the whole congregation to make it work and make our committee more than just talk.

If we're willing to put in the work and have faith in God, I am hopeful for bright days ahead.

# Correspondence

- We received a request for donation to Family Promise. Since we have already made a \$100 donation this year, this request will be held until 2024 for donation.
- A subscription notice from Palmerton Community Ambulance was not approved.

**Secretary's Report** – On motion by Delbert, second by Pearl and voice vote, the October 19, 2023 minutes were approved. On motion by Wanda, second by Sandy and voice vote, the October 29, 2023 minutes were approved.

**Treasurer's Report** – A report of profit from the basket social was presented, showing a profit of \$5,337.64. However, we have not received the Times News invoice for advertisement and that will change the net profit. On motion by Jackie, second by Bobby and voice vote, the Treasurer's Report was approved.

**Financial Secretary's Report** – Revised monthly collection reports were received, and approval of the Financial Secretary's Report was tabled until these changes can be explained.

# Pastor's Report

- Our membership rolls have been updated in the computer system. Active membership is 173 as of October 31, 2023. This includes 150 confirmed members and 23 children not yet confirmed.
- We will have a special music presentation at the December 10 service.
- Resa Hall has volunteered to take charge of vacation bible school. We will need additional volunteers. No date has been set.
- Pastor will be meeting with the Bishop next month to discuss the parish arrangement. He asked for any concerns or compliments. There were no negative comments, all present feel the joint situation is going well.
- At a recent parish meeting, it was decided that combined services will be held once per quarter starting in 2024. Additional
  information and details will follow.
- It has been several years since a Thanksgiving Eve service has been held. Discussion can be held in 2024 if we wish to revive this service.
- On motion by Pearl, second by Delbert and voice vote, the following individuals were approved to serve on the Mutual Ministry Committee: Roger Christman, Jackie Brotzman, and Donna McGarry
- On motion by Bobby, second by Jackie and voice vote, Council approved Pastor's mileage reimbursement in the amount of \$277.72

### **Finance**

 On motion by Pearl, second by Delbert and voice vote, the 2024 Budget was approved. It will be presented at a congregational meeting on December 3.

### **Building & Maintenance**

- Quotes are being sought for replacement of two air conditioning units. There are two options air conditioning units or heat pump units. Rolf believes the heat pump units, while more expensive, will pay off in the long run due to a decrease in heating oil consumption.
- Replacement of copper piping with PEX will be part of the air conditioning work.
- The water supply passed testing after George's came in and cleaned the UV light unit.
- George and Pat Dwinell are working on lighting improvement ideas for the steeple.
- The picnic grove was cleared of leaves and Luther Hall will be closed down until spring. Delbert suggested we establish a list of seasonal maintenance items for future reference.

- Pearl announced that we are seeking volunteers for the Alter Guild.
