

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" -2 Corinthians 5:17

Having returned from Synod Assembly this past week, I am struck by the one word that seems to strike fear in the hearts of individuals and churches alike: Change. We have, without a doubt, experienced a dramatic change in our church experiences and

in our culture over the last 10 years, let alone compared to whatever we remember Church being as a child.

I think to my home congregation. A place of over 200 on a Sunday morning with a thriving youth and children's ministry. More volunteers than one would possibly know what to do with. One could consider it healthy in many ways, even though it was hard for me as a teenager to learn so many names! Fortunately, everyone sat in the same pew every Sunday, so I got to know our "pew neighbors" very well!

Fast forward 20 years later and that same church has less than half of that attendance. Ministries change. Pastors change. Culture changes. Pew neighbors go on to be with Jesus. It's different. And frankly, many of us don't know what to do with that.

There are two notes about change in the Bible that I'd like to point out. First is that the Scriptures are filled with change. Some of those are adaptive changes – how the people of God respond to new challenges (sound familiar?). If you think the current situation is tough, read prophets like Isaiah or Jeremiah where pretty well the whole nation turns to sin and idols instead of God. Humans really haven't changed that much in 3,000 years, even if we like to be moan how terrible things are now.

There are also wildly beneficial changes. We, who were dead in sin, are made alive in Christ. The theme of this year's Synod Assembly was "Moving Beyond Death to Life." What an incredible God who looks upon us and changes our very being to be like Christ. To give us "God's righteousness" so that we may stand before God not as a trembling sinner waiting for the lightning bolt, but as a freed and forgiven child of God! God gives us life!

One of the visions that Bishop DeForest has laid out for the synod is one of partnership. You have been learning this over the past year and a half through a parish arrangement. The hope is to bring more partnership to this synod and to encourage one another and share our gifts. That will mean bringing in Deacons to the Synod (professional, seminary trained individuals who have a focus on Word and Service ministries). That will mean specialized training for qualified members within the congregation to serve as Lay Authorized Ministers and serve your congregation in an official capacity. The plan looks like this: 6261...

- 6 Congregations with
- 2 Pastors
- 6 Lay Ministers and
- 1 Deacon

The hope is that this addresses some realities – there are not enough clergy to serve our congregations and nearly every congregation cannot fit the one-pastor-to-one-church model any longer. It also addresses congregation's needs when a pastor is away for vacation or becomes ill. It allows the leaders to specialize – maybe one pastor is really good at running meetings and the other pastor hates doing them. You get the best of all of your professional leaders! While this is a vision and a recommendation for moving forward, I will encourage us to take a look at new ways of doing ministry that supports the needs of the congregation as we, too, look forward to moving from death to life!

I'll admit – change is scary. It's usually scary because it seems so very unknown. I had mentioned I wanted to say two things about change. The second is this – God is unchanging. God is unchanging in His great love for this Church. God is unchanging in His work to restore all creation. God is unchanging in His promise to walk with us and be with us "even to the end of the age."

We've been through change. We need to talk about that together. We need to lament losses and celebrate new opportunities. We need to think about being Church in new ways. It's going to be tough – but it's going to be good!

Open Forum -

- Roger Christman suggested (through Sandy) that council consider eliminating announcements to shorten service to allow pastor time to get to his other parish and/or meet with new people. Pastor suggests that announcements be at 8:55, then the prelude, then the start of worship.
- Wanda made a motion to allow Stacy to take home non-confidential paperwork from the church and burn it. Frank seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Stacy requested time off this Wednesday & Thursday for funeral and she would work Monday & Tuesday to make up her time.

- Jackie made a motion to approve this report. Delbert seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Discussion was held regarding what to do with the funds in memorial fund, where there are no surviving family members.
 This fund is not restricted. If any funds were to be used, a courtesy contact would need to be made to the family to let them know that we would like to use those funds and what they would be used for.
- Melanie will condense the memorial fund to take out the non-nominal people.
- Financial statement for basket social

Financial Secretary's Report (Motion Required)

Frank motion to approve. Rolf seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report (Motion required ONLY for mileage)

- Jackie approved the Pastor's mileage. Sandy seconded the mileage. Motion carried
- The Pastor submitted a sign-up sheet for him to meet with council members.
- Pastor noted he would be on Vacation on June 4. Frank has agreed to step in.

Ongoing and Unfinished Business

- Quote for the window in the office Window world measured window. Stacy does not want a fixed window she would like it to open to transact business for tickets. Double-hung vs. a slider.
 - The slider cost is \$875. The double-hung is \$764. Insulated/double paned, vinyl white. Set-up fee of \$295 is included in the entire price of the window. Bobby wants the money to come from Susie's memorial fund to cover the cost. Sandy asked that Roger have one more chance to submit a bid.
- Rolf has a quote for a used freezer for the ice cream stand. Not new and out of warranty status. It's a very good brand
 freezer/cooler. It is stainless steel. Size is about 35" high/70" long/6 top doors. The asking price \$2,500. Rolf feels that it is
 not worth it. He suggests we look at a newer one. Keep the old ones for another year or two.
- Melanie suggested we consider locking the door to the storage room between pastor's office and main office. She
 recommends a locking doorknob be added to the door with keys made and given to those who use that room. Also move
 the building key board and possibly purchase a lock box for all the keys

• Delbert spoke on the audit report. He questioned WELCA's position in the audit process. Pastor noted that WELCA is technically their own separate entity and is responsible for their own audit to be complete and submitted to the synod. However, they can include it with the church audit.

Personnel Concerns

- Stacy is now keeping all doors locked.
- Pastor noted that only one person spoke with him regarding issues before the Sexton review, which was held with Connie Smale, Sandy Christman & Pastor being present.
- Kelly commented that if anyone has concerns about her work to, go to her directly. That she is open to suggestions and issues to be addressed.
- At the time of her hire the list of Sexton duties were not completed or approved by council so she didn't receive it.
- The review committee recommends to advance her from \$12 to \$14 per hour.
- After continued discussion Rolf made a motion to table the compensation until our next council meeting. The motion was seconded by Frank. Motion carried.






