

Dear Friends in Christ,

What is your favorite hobby? For me, my love of video games began when my grandparents bought me my Super Nintendo thirty years ago. I've been hooked ever since. Even within the realm of video games, there are many different genres. My favorite are RPGs (Role Playing Games). The downside of them is that they take much longer than a simple arcade game to finish. It's the upside, though, that I find most interesting. They are games that are heavily story-driven. They cemented early on a love for storytelling and creative expression.

Every Sunday, we gather together to hear the most important historical stories we will ever hear. They are a part of what we call a "Lectionary" – a series of readings that is appointed for the day. Since we use the bulletin insert, you know that I am not simply choosing the readings for each Sunday.

There's a reason for that. Folks who are far smarter than I put together this "Lectionary," which we read over the course of three years. That means that reading you're hearing next Sunday? You'll hear it again in three years (possibly earlier). It makes sure that we hear many of the themes of the Bible, even though we don't cover the whole thing in three years. It also gives us a great opportunity to talk about the readings for the day. Many different churches, not just Lutheran, use that same lectionary. It's very likely your friend or family member who goes to church out in Nebraska heard the same Scripture readings you did. It allows for conversation.

When I played my first role-playing game back in 1993, I fell in love with the story. It's still my favorite game thirty years later. A game from the same series became the inspiration for my daughter's name. It is my prayer that all of us become so captivated with the words of God so that the Bible becomes our favorite series of books.

Council Meeting Minutes from March 16, 2023

Secretary's Report

• Bobby Ziegenfus made a motion to approve this report. Wanda George seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

• Frank Hall made a motion to approve this report. Pearl Eckhart seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report (Motion Required)

 Discussion was held regarding breaking out the categories, so there is a clearer, more easily understood picture of our giving. Jackie Brotzman made a motion to accept this report with the noted corrections i.e. adding Sunday School column and correcting amounts and explanations under notes. Pearl Eckhart seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Pastor's Report (Motion required ONLY for mileage)

- Delbert Christman made a motion to approve Page 1 of Sexton Duties. Bobby Ziegenfus seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Delbert made a motion to form a Policy Committee. Sandy Christman seconded the motion. The motion carried. Policy book should be in one accessible place where everyone on council can access it. Each document should have a created date and an approved date in the footer.
- Sunday after Easter Pastor will start in the sanctuary at 8:30 to talk about where the money goes when it is sent to the Synod.
- Synod delegates for 2023 will be Roger & Sandy Christman
- Ricky Moyer made a motion to approve the Pastor's mileage of 340 miles for \$222.70. Pearl seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- Pastor & Frank are working on slowly getting the choir started again.
- Jackie Brotzman made a motion to pay \$100 to the substitute organist for Easter Vigil. Wanda George seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Ongoing and Unfinished Business:

- Discussion was held about ushers/greeters. Sign-up sheet for greeters has been suggested to free up council members on Sunday mornings. A rally day in September was suggested and, on that day, open the sign-ups for opportunities to serve. Shorten service to talk about ways people can serve and then sign up.
- Alarm system has been contacted and updated. Melanie will share that information with Kelly.
- Susan Lovejoy will hopefully be here next month to talk about our Thrivent accounts.
- Melanie Windhorn discussed combining our building fund with our general fund because ELCA congregations should have only one checking account. Discussion was held in regard to....Do we close the building fund account and track it separately or blend it all. Since we adopted a building fund budget, we should track it. Also, if we combine the two accounts, we must have a congregational meeting to approve it. It would be presented as a group decision and wouldn't need to have a second. It was discussed to continue until the new budget is adopted and start accordingly in the new year.
- Delbert Christman made a motion that the council should direct the finance committee to explore a single budget in preparing for 2024. Pearl Eckhart seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- All people who handle money should be covered under a bond. If money is stolen the bond company returns the money. Melanie Windhorn will get the information on the cost to bond herself and Carol O'Brien and relay it to council.
- Melanie contacted the insurance company about having alcohol. We would not be liable for alcoholic incidents at Luther Hall. Jackie Brotzman said there is wording in the hall usage policy stating no alcohol is permitted on the premises.
- Melanie is having difficulties with our current accountants. Pastor has agreed, after reading email transmissions. that he has been unprofessional and rude. She has suggested signing up after tax season with Jill Wentz, in Palmerton.

Personnel Concerns

• Sandy Christman explained the sexton duties that she, Shirley Craig, and Connie Strohl wrote up. Strong discussion on who should be responsible for Weddings & Funerals. This will be reviewed with Kelly during her 90-day review which is now due. Pastor will set up the date for her review.

Committee Reports

Finance

We need to have the books audited. Delbert Christman & Donna McGarry will do the books to get the signed form to Synod before March 31st. Pastor noted that the auditors should be council members.

Music & Worship

• Pastor and Frank are slowly working on getting the choir back up and running.

- Wanda made 12 Easter bags for Sunday School students to be given out on Palm Sunday. Frank Hall will provide his talents for the children as the Easter Bunny on Palm Sunday during coffee hour.
- VBS will be held at St. Johns this year. A combined meeting of the Parishes will be held after worship at St. John's on March 26th.

Building & Maintenance

- Picnic feasibility group, met on Monday.
- It was suggested to avoid another brainstorming meeting and have 3-5 ideas/options to present to council. This group will start with a master plan and then break the project down into phases.
- It was noted that our steeple needs to be pressure washed and painted. Rolf/Melanie will check with Peters for a reference (they painted the Narthex & hallway). Holy Trinity had work done. Pastor will check with Pastor Frost.
- We need a new mower. Bobby will present a few prices at our next council meeting.

- April 3 cemetery clean up.
- Melanie Windhorn noted that the window in the office is a sliding window, and we don't use it. It is not energy efficient. She is suggesting we have a replacement window installed. Roger Christman may be able to provide a quote. Window World has good quality windows (per Melanie). Two quotes by Melanie and Sandy will be presented at our next council meeting.


